## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER # 19

It appearing to the Court due to considerations of judicial economy and the status of the docket of cases normally heard at the Big Stone Gap Courthouse (Big Stone Gap cases) in the Roanoke Division of this Court that one regular session of this Court in Big Stone Gap on a monthly basis is appropriate and provides adequate service to such location, it is

## ORDERED

that the sessions of this Court now scheduled for April 21, May 19, June 16 and July 14 are hereby CANCELLED. It is further

### **ORDERED**

that the Court generally will schedule court sessions in Big Stone Gap on the first Tuesday of each month, subject to courtroom availability, legal holidays, other competing demands on the Court's time and resources or other good cause. Any Big Stone Gap case matters needing to be heard between scheduled Big Stone Gap court dates may be scheduled on any intervening Abingdon court date, provided that any debtor in a Big Stone Gap case against whom a motion for relief is scheduled to be heard on an Abingdon date and who desires to contest such motion in Big Stone Gap may file with the Court a written request to such effect, copies of which shall be sent to counsel for the movant and the applicable case trustee, or if none, the Office of the United States Trustee, in which event the scheduled Abingdon date for such motion shall be treated as a preliminary hearing upon such motion in which the debtor and counsel for the debtor, if any, may participate by telephone, and the final hearing upon which shall be scheduled for a Big Stone Gap date as directed by the Court. The Court's standard pre-hearing order shall be revised to contain language setting forth this procedure with respect to such orders entered in Big Stone Gap cases. It is further

## ORDERED

that this Court will schedule other Big Stone Gap dates, whether by video conferencing technology or in the traditional manner, as may be necessary or beneficial to the administration of justice with respect to Big Stone Gap cases, as circumstances may suggest appropriate from time to time.

Service of a copy of this Order is to be made on the Honorable James P. Jones, Chief District Judge; the Honorable William F. Stone, Jr., Judge; the Honorable William E. Anderson, Judge; Elizabeth H. Sharp, Deputy in Charge of the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia in Big Stone Gap; Jo S. Widener, Esquire, Chapter 13 Trustee for Big Stone Gap cases; and the Office of the United States Trustee.
